Historical Society publishes cookbook 136 years in the making

Nearly one thousand recipes representing the “cream” of Saginaw’s culinary history starting in 1871 fill the pages of the Historical Society of Saginaw County’s new cookbook, “Savoring Saginaw.” Compiled and kitchen-tested by editors, Jean Beach and Pat Shek, the cookbook was shelved by another group some twenty-five years ago. In honor of Saginaw’s 150th birthday, Castle Director, Irene Hensinger, saw the book as a way to celebrate a unique aspect of this great city’s rich (and delicious) history.

Recipes include “Great-Great Grandmother Mooney’s Brown Bread,” “Ella B. Shaw’s Opera Creams,” wild game, beverages and other menu builders. Entries from some of Saginaw’s most recognizable names such as Mershon, Heavenrich, Mudd, Rust, Morley, are sandwiched amongst a variety of historic Saginaw photos. Unlike other books of its kind, “Savoring Saginaw” also includes recipes for a number of non-edibles such as stain lifters, furniture polish and hand lotion!
