HISTORY OF SAGINAW COUNTY BOY SCOUTS EXPLORED IN MUSEUM EXHIBIT

100 Years of Boy Scouts in Saginaw County is the focus of a new exhibit that will open at the Castle Museum of Saginaw County History on Saturday, May 1.

To commemorate the opening, more than 100 Boy Scouts from area troops will visit the Museum for a ribbon cutting ceremony at 2 p.m. on May 1. The Scouts are planning to camp out at Hoyt Park Friday night and will walk to the Museum on Saturday to see the exhibit.

The exhibit is on display in the Museum's lobby and is anchored by a nine-foot-tall teepee. The exhibit also includes clothing, badges, tools and a rare video from a Boy Scout camporee at Hoyt Park in the 1930s.

All Boy Scouts receive free admission to the Museum throughout the course of the exhibit, which will be on display through August 2010. Any Boy Scout troop interested in a badge workshop can contact Education Coordinator Heather Thompson at 752-2861, Ext. 311.

The Castle Museum is open Tuesday through Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and Sunday from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.
