**MUSEUM PAYS TRIBUTE TO ROCK AND ROLL HISTORY**

The Castle Museum of Saginaw County History takes a fun look at the history of rock and roll with a collection of posters from the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland.

Accompanying the posters are items from the Castle Museum's collection documenting the impact on rock and roll, including many items from one of Saginaw's most popular music venues, Daniel's Den. When it opened in the 1960s, this teenage hot spot was the "place to be." Many musicians performed there, such as Bob Seger and Sonny and Cher.

**On Tuesday, May 4<sup>th</sup>, Bo White, owner of White's Bar, will speak at Noon about Daniel's Den and its place in Saginaw County music lore.** Mr. White will speak as part of the Museum's Lunch and Learn series, which is free with paid admission to the museum. Guests are welcome to bring their own lunch. The Museum provides coffee and dessert.

The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame exhibit is on display through May 30. The Castle Museum's artifacts will be on display through the summer.
